In the Statutes of the Realm (vol. I. p. 242) there is a similar set of Articles, entitled Extenta Maneriorum, transcribed from the Liber Horn now in the archives of the city of London; and it is stated, that in printed copies of the Statutes these articles are inserted as a statute of 4 Edw. I. Fleta (Book II. c. lxxi.) recommends the use of such an extension of the particulars of a manor, and inserts Articles of inquisition, which, with some omissions, appear to be the same with those in the Liber Horn. The Extenta, or Articles, as here given from the St. Pauls document, the first clause excepted, are more full and complete, especially with respect to the praedial services of the tenants, than they are in the Liber Horn, or in Fletas copy.
